- The PT-26 is essentially a PT-19 with a canopy, larger engine, and better instrumentation
- The aircraft was built mainly of wood, the fuselage is fabric over wood-capped steel tubing
- The engine is a 200 hp, air-cooled Ranger inverted six cylinder
