- This aircraft is painted in RAF camouflage air transport color scheme with invasion "D-Day" stripes. The colors were selected from matched paint chips and are authentic right down to the numbers on the side, which were on the aircraft that Col Vic Hewes flew in service of the RAF in WWII.
